Purpose of this study:

Researchers from the Department of Dermatology and Skin Science are conducting this study to examine the effectiveness of a new investigational cream to treat atopic dermatitis.

Who can participate?

- Participants need to be between the ages of 18 to 65 with atopic dermatitis, a form of eczema.

What is involved?

- The research study may require up to 9 clinical visits over 14 weeks.
- For the first six (6) weeks, research participants will receive either the investigational study cream OR a cream that does not contain a study drug.
- For an additional six (6) weeks, ALL research participants will receive the investigational study cream.
- Blood samples will be drawn.

Please note: Qualified participants will receive free study medication and will be reimbursed for travel expenses.

When does this study take place?

This study commenced on October 26th, 2009. Recruitment closes March 28th, 2010. The end of this study is the 29th October, 2010.
